- 1) Think and prepare some information on the theme of your blog you want to share with your blog readers.
- 2) Study the tools for creating infographics and choose an appropriate one which serves your purpose better, and create infographic.
- 3) Share it with your blog readers – post it.

1. **EASEL.LY** <http://www.easel.ly/>

Specialized service for creating infographics. 16 template categories and the ability to create your own. Most of the templates do not look too elegant.

2. **INFOGR.AM** <https://infogr.am/>

Create interactive infographics in minimalist interest. The service integrates with Google Analytics.

3. **PIKTOCHART** <http://piktochart.com/>

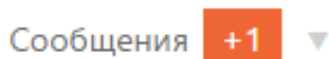
Service for creating infographics, posters, reports and presentations. Contains a built-in collection of clipart icons and images.

4. **VENNGAGE** <https://venngage.com/>

The service has all the necessary functions, but it works rather slowly. Allows you to embed graphics with Vizualize.me.

5. **Canva** https://www.canva.com/ru_ru/grafiki/

A tool for creating any graphics. "Infographics" is selected from the template and then one of the proposed layouts. Replaced elements and backgrounds from pre-installed or downloaded ones of their own.

TASK 2



ANNOTATED WEBLIOGRAPHY

When we study we often make lists of useful sources; bloggers often provide an **annotated webliography** on the theme of the blog.

webliography = web + bibliography

1) Study the definition and examples for an annotated webliography.

An **annotated webliography** is the same as just a webliography but with one important difference: in an annotated bibliography, the link is followed by a brief description of the content, quality, and usefulness of the source.

E.g. <http://plagiarisma.net/> – a free online plagiarism checker («Антиплагиат»). It detects copyright infringement in your essays, research paper, coursework or dissertation. It supports more than 190 languages. You can paste a text for detecting copyright infringement or upload it from a drive, or from your computer. It will only take a few minutes to check your document. It shows unique content in percentage and number of sentences as well as plagiarizing domains (sites), and number of matches from them.
